I got a very big surprise when I received a copy of Country Guitar article on Dwight Yoakam. On first glance it is just your standard interview but further on into the article Dwight makes a great statement. This is a direct quote from this article. "As a musician, I know however, that for me, the root core influence has been and always will be, inescapably, mountain music, the rural form of musical expression that I heard in Appalachian and southeastern Kentucky, innate to my parochial past. With that in mind, I have to add that when Ralph Stanley asked me to join him in recording a song of mine, "Miner's Prayer", for his latest album Saturday Night - Sunday

Morning, That was the greatest honor I've achieved in my music career". What a statement coming from one of the top performing Country artist. Thanks to Dick Freeland for sending me copies of these great reviews.

Country and Bluegrass Music News for the month of December had 2 nice articles that mentioned Ralph. First they told about Ralph receiving the Recorded Event Of The Year for Saturday Night - Sunday Morning album. Also they had a nice write up on the reissued of the album "OLD COUNTRY CHURCH" which is some of the finest gospel material that Ralph and Carter put out. Those of you that don't have one of the original King labels can now get one of these on tape. On this album with Ralph and Carter are Curley Lambert on mandolin, Vernon Derrick on fiddle and Chick Stripling on bass.

It was a full house and everyone was excited about the outstanding performance that Ralph and the boys gave. He gave two great performances and did some outstanding music.

Faye and Homer Elam Were at the Miami University in Middletown, Oh and they report that Ralph received an standing

ovation at the concert. They also report that Paul Mullins thanked everyone for standing up for Ralph and showing their appreciation for what he stands for and for the music he plays. There's nothing like that Mountain music.

STANLEY BANJOS

Ralph still has a few of the 40th Anniversary Banjos for sale. Five have been sold already so that leaves 20 left to go. After number 25 there will not be any more folks. These are a high quality banjo designed and crafted by Frank Neat. They have that great Stanley Sound that you can't find in any other banjo. They are gold plated with engraving on the arm rest and on the flange of the banjo. They have Ralph's name on the headstock and 40th Anniversary on the fingerboard. They are really a collectors item. BANJO VIDEO

Smithsonian/Folkways has produced a video called THE BANJO OF RALPH STANLEY taught by Ralph himself. this tape starts with the first tunes that Ralph learned from his mother in the old time clawhammer style. There are about three different clawhammer styles that he shows us. Ralph also shows us the two finger style that he learned and also the three finger style that he now plays. This is not just an instructional tape, it is full of great music too. Some of the tunes on the tape, along with the Clinch Mt. Boys - even Ralph II is helping on a few of these - are Little Maggie, Hard Times, Dickenson County Breakdown, Little Birdie, Shout

Little Lulie, Clinch Mountain Backstep, Train 45 and many many more. This is a 90 minute tape of classic Stanley Music. If you are a banjo picker like me you definitely want to get one of these. If not you still will want one of these in your video library. The music alone is worth the cost of the tape. It's not often that you get to see Ralph on tape playing that great Mountain music that he made famous. It is tucked away on top of a mountain outside of McClure, Va. and the view is breathtaking. Beautiful sunrises and sunsets and the best in talent. And for all you pickers there is always jammin' going on at any time of the day or night. Doc Watson will be Ralph's special guest this year. He will be performing Friday and Saturday. Along with Ralph this year will be Charlie Sizemore, Traditional Grass, Jimmy Martin, Larry Sparks, Wild Wood Girls, and many others. The dates this year will be May 26-27-28. There are

plenty of area motels in case you don't want to camp at the festival site. But for all you people who do like to camp there are hookups on a first come first serve basis, and be sure to bring your lawn chairs. There is a shed in front of the stage that will keep you out of the rain and the sun. It's not hard to find and there is always someone to tell you how to get there, and plenty of great people to help you out when you get there.. There will be signs out also directing you to the festival site. You'll return year after year because in my book it is the best festival of all festivals. YA'LL COME.
