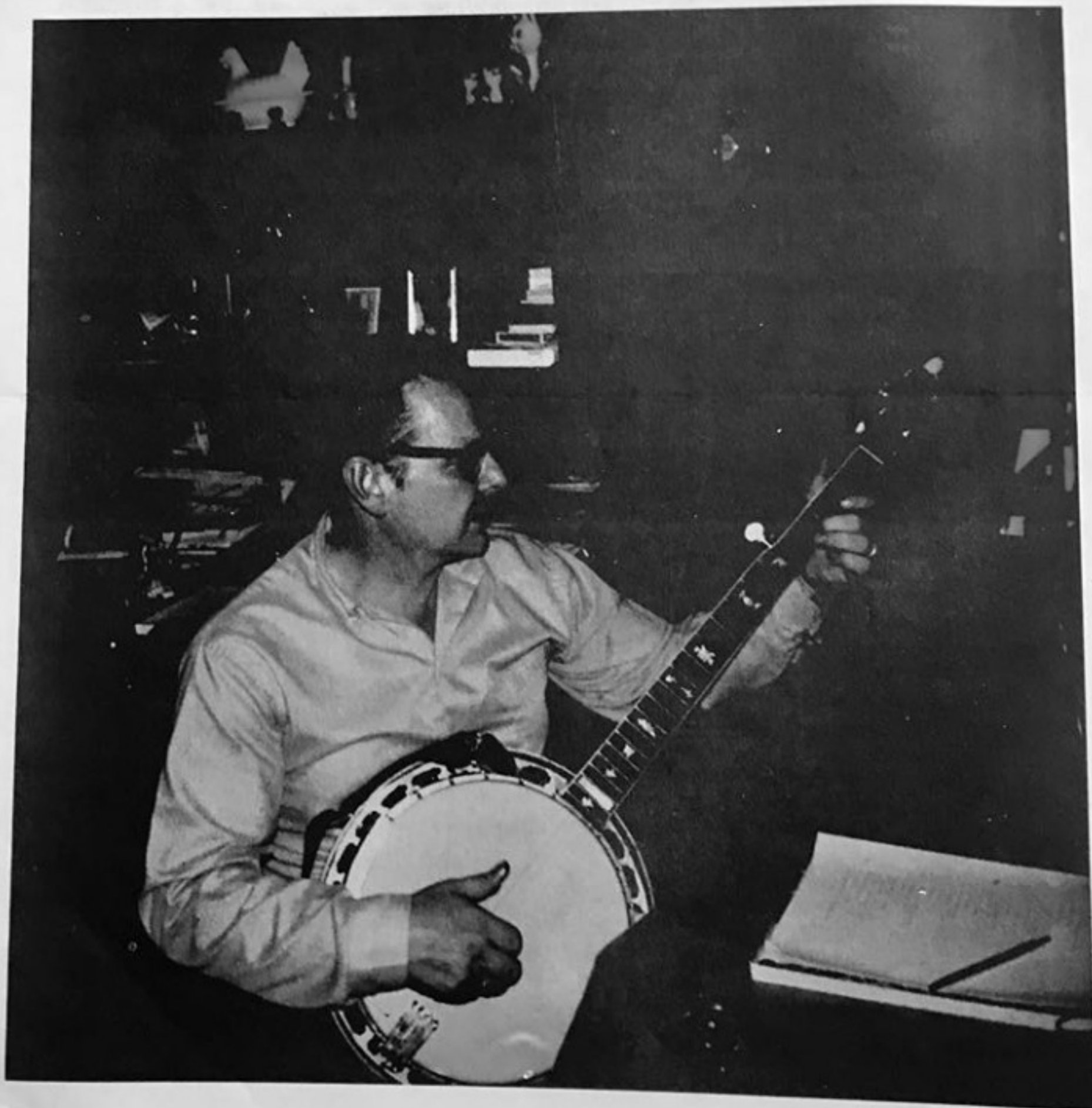

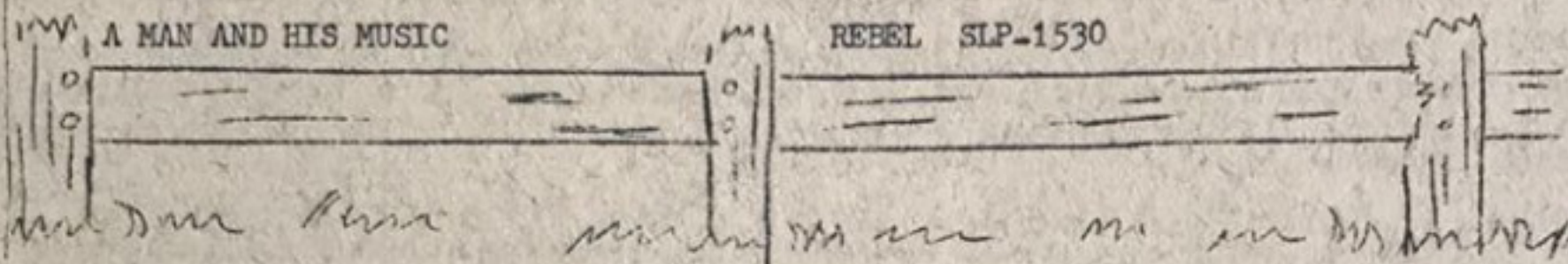
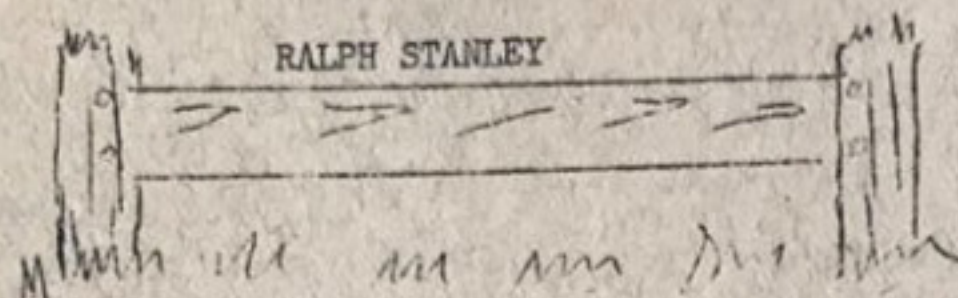
This award not only gives credit to some deserving person, but pays honor to Carter and what he did for the music world. I am proud to be a part of this each year and happy that our club has supported the event each year.

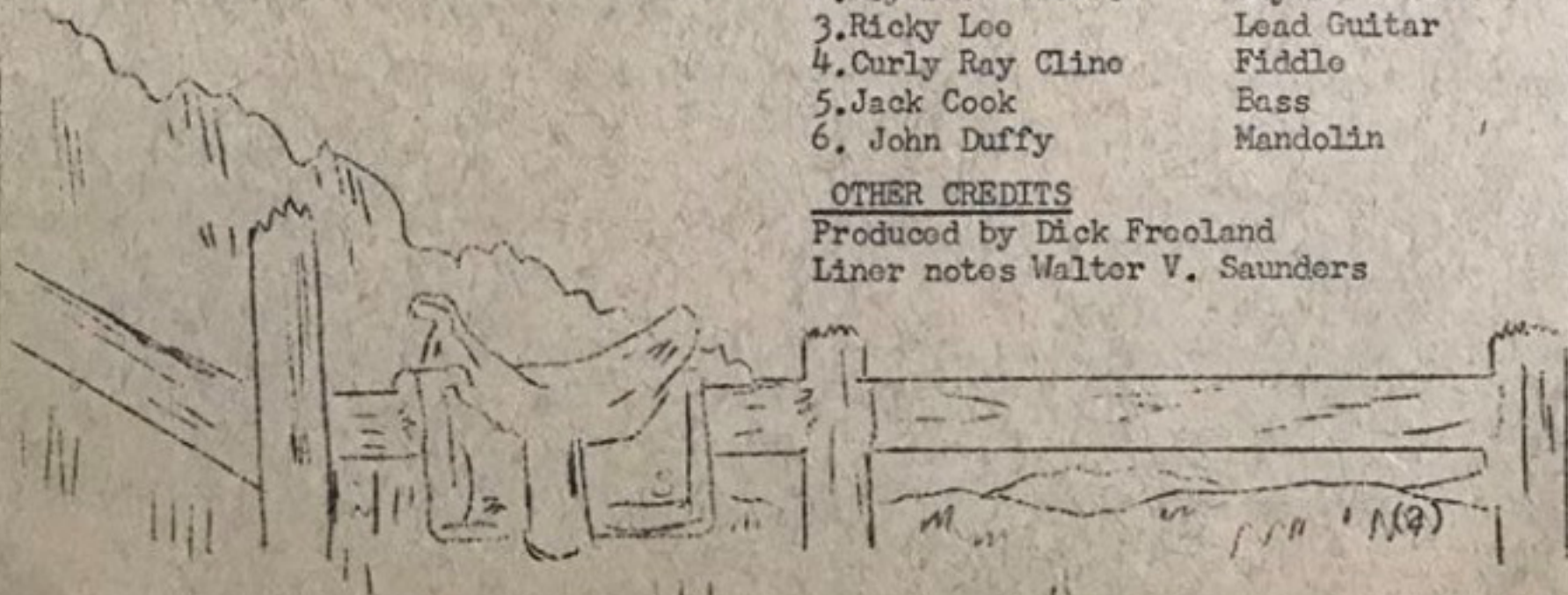

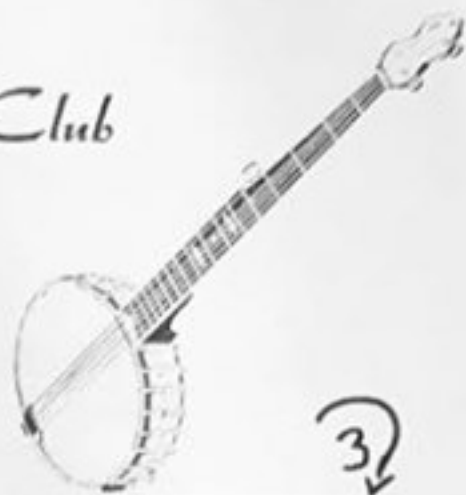

SHOW REPORTS

Nancy Callahan writes.....Ralph Stanley and The Clinch Mt. Boys were at Lake Norman Music Hall at Terrell, N.C. March 9th. As always they were just great, I think they get better each time I see them. Like alot of other people, I think they are the best in the business.

They did some old songs like Dark Hollow, Knoxville Girl and Ralph sang Little Joe. He should do that one more often.

R.C. Harris and The Blue Denim were also on this show. They are from Statesville, N.C. They do a fine job, be sure to see them when they are near you.

I also got up to Stuart, Va. March 23 at Patrick High School. I have forgotten the name of the local band, but they were good. I met alot of nice people there, in fact there was a full house.

Minnie Gates.....July 27th. 73 the second Bluegrass Festival took place at John Moxom's farm in Hardwoodlands, Hants County. It was arranged by our friend Fred Isnor and he reports that it was a great success. Many bluegrass entertainers took part, and a large crowd gathered to witness the picking and singing. It rained about all evening, but it didn't dampen the spirits of the fans that attended. When bluegrass fans have a festival to attend they'll go rain or shine.

Again this year Vic Mullen was MC and played banjo. The other great entertainers were Neil Rosenberg of Newfoundland (you may remember Neil with Bill Monroe a few years ago. I had the pleasure of meeting Neil at Fred's place Aug. 11th. when Fred arranged a music session. Neil and I had a nice chat and he is a wonderful banjo picker) Don and Joyce Peck of Halifax were there. Fred Isenor (he is a good bass and mandolin player) Bonnie Newman of Hants County did her bit, also Charlie Fullerton. The Boutilier Bros. were there, Larry, Kenny and Bill. Mel Slauty and his group, Gregory Kehoe of Lunenburg County, Ed Himes, Vic MacDonald and Buster Mac Master of Air Force Base in Annapolis Valley, Zoel Richard and son, Jean Paul of Mass. Beryl Robertson told me that Paul is only 13 years old and is already a fine bajo picker. Also on the festival were Dale Wood and Ron Mac Eachern.

If any of you are ever in this area at festival time, you are vited to attend. I am so happy that bluegrass music is doing so well in Nova Scotia and hope it will continue for many years to come. Fred is planning another festival in Hardwoodlands next year. Fred and his associates have a record and instrument shop. If you are up this way stop by and take a look at their many bluegrass records.

Nancy Callahan.....I would like to tell about the Myrtle Beach, N.C. festival. It was just great. The weather was beautiful. We didn't sleep much, but who wants to sleep with all that good music around. There were alot of good bands, like James Monroe, but it would take all day to tell about the good music, so I'll just talk about our

favorite, Ralph Stanley and The Clinch Mountain Boys. They were there Sat. and Sun. They put on great shows as usual. They did "Will You Miss Me", "God Gave You To Me" and alot of other good songs. Ralph couldn't find a better lead singer than Roy Lee Konters. I think that Curly, Ricky Lee and Jack Cook are all great.

I had the pleasure of meeting Ralph's wife Jimmie. I sure enjoyed talking to her and look forward to seeing her again at festivals this summer.

QUESTION by a member: Did Ralph have a mandoline player with him last year? Did he record with the group?

ANSWER. Ricky Skaggs was with Ralph for about 2 years (he is now playing fiddle with the Country Gentlemen). Yes he did record, three Rebel albums..I think.

NOTES FROM THE C.M.A. CLOSE-UP

The CMA has been leading an all-out fight against Tape Piracy. This should interest every one interested in any form of recorded music. LeRoy VanDyke says "Tape piracy is to the music industry what painting forgeries are to the art world, plagiarism to the literary world, and 'hot' merchandise to the retail sales world. Piracy not only deprives honest people of deserved income from their talent and effort; it cheapens and casts a credibility pall upon our entire industry".

Nashville has joined with the state of Tenn., Ky., New Mexico and many others to pass legislature dealing with the making and selling of bootlegged tapes.

Indiana statute against bootlegged tapes cites the first offense as a misdemeanor with maximum penalties of \$2000 and one year in prison for illegal duplication and distribution and the second offense a felony with penalties being 10 years in prison and \$5000 fine.

NEWS RELEASE FROM OPRYLAND

March 16th. was grand opening for the \$15 million dollar Opryland Opry House. New Home of the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville. Bud Wenell was retained as Opry and Opryland manager. Most regular Opry members appeared, with such guest as President and Mrs. Nixon attending.

This is the 7th. home of the WSM Barn Dance that began in 1925. George D. Hay later started the name "Grand Ole Opry". The Ryman Auditorium housed this regular show and broadcast since 1943.

Each March 16th. an award will be given in honor of George D. Hay, "the solemn ole judge". Seven awards were given this year to; Roy Acuff, Chet Atkins, Owen Bradley, Edwin W. Craig, Jack Strapp, Bill Monroe and Cohen T. Williams. Mr. Hay's daughter Margaret Hay Daughtry was in the audience for this event.

The new Opry House is air conditioned and seats 4,400. Plenty of parking too! Anyone impressed with all this should plan on attending the Wed. night bluegrass concert to start the Fan Fair when Ralph Stanley and The Clinch Mountain Boys will be on the show.

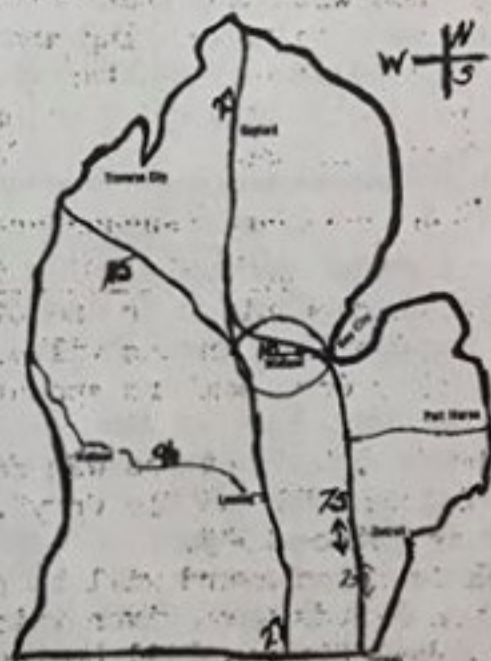
